Ambulance Service urges people to download address finder app - what3words

LIVES could be saved this summer by a new system being used by the South Western Ambulance Service. It has recently adopted the three-word global address system called what3words in its control room to locate patients.

Callers using 999 can use the free app to find the three-word address for their location and share it with the call handler. The control room can then use the address to identify the precise location and send help to where it is needed. The service is encouraging people to download the app but only to use it in a genuine emergency.

what3words divides the world into 57 trillion nine-square-metre areas and gives each a unique three-word address. The system is intended to give callers a simple way to say exactly where help is needed and allow resources to be sent straight to the scene.

Needing urgent help and not being able to easily describe where you are can be very distressing for the person involved and a really difficult situation for emergency services. Today people nearly always have their phone on them. We need to use the tools at our disposal to improve public services and potentially save lives.

Just as you may have your (ICE) In Case of Emergency contacts set up on your phone, we encourage everyone to download the app to make sure they are ready to quickly share accurate location information should the worst happen. It's free, it's simple to use and one day it might make sure you get the help you need when you need it most.

Early warning! The salt bags for de-icing public roads in the area will be stored temporarily at the new Village Hall. Please arrange to collect a bag before the possible bad weather arrives if you feel that it would be appropriate to have one nearer to where you live. This is the last delivery of free salt bags from the council so be quick if you want one! Only 8 left.



Report :

On Tuesday, the 3rd of September the Holford History Society held a delightful evening when we recreated an Antiques Road Show here in Holford. Peter Rixon from Greenslade Taylor Hunt was our resident expert for the evening. He gave a fascinating talk about his time in the antiques trade. Peter told us about his most valuable find, a Barbara Hepworth sculpture.



His most unusual find was HM The Queen's provisional driving license and the biggest collection he had to deal with was an entire house filled with a model train collection. He then looked at some of the objects brought in by the audience. He spoke about Trench Art from The Great War, valuable time pieces, porcelain and interesting old prints.

Consumption of cheese, fruit, bread and wine added to this enjoyable evening.

8. Reduce the amount of fossil fuels you use personally - for driving, flying, heating, power, plastic packaging, etc.

Recipe

To all Cooks of Holford: Instead of the anticipated Holford Cook Book, HNV have kindly allowed us to forward recipes every so often to be published. During this summer – Australia has definitely been the flavour of visitors and events, so I thought the following from Queensland neighbour Chris, might be quite in keeping!

Lamingtons

A lamington is an Australian cake originally created in Queensland.

Lamingtons are easier to make with sponge cake that is a couple of days old because dipping the cake into the chocolate mixture can be challenging if the cake is too fresh. Good luck!

Cake

125g softened butter
1 cup caster sugar
½ teaspoon vanilla extract
3 eggs
1 ¾ cup self raising flour, sifted
½ cup milk
2 cups desiccated coconut

Icing

3 ½ cups icing sugar
¼ cup cocoa powder
1 tbsp butter
½ cup boiling water

Method

Cake

Heat oven to 160°C fan, grease and line a square baking tin
Beat the butter, sugar and vanilla until light and fluffy
Add eggs, stir in half flour then add half milk, stir.
Repeat for remaining flour and milk then spoon the mixture into the tin Bake for 30 minutes. Stand for 10 minutes then turn out onto cooling rack Cover and set aside – overnight at least

Icing

Cut the cake into 15 pieces of equal size
Sift the icing sugar and cocoa into a bowl
Add butter and boiling water and stir until smooth
Dip each piece of cake into the icing mixture and shake off excess and coat in coconut on all sides.
Place pieces onto a cooling rack to dry – this could take 2 hours.

Parish Council Chairman's Report - September 2019

Since our last meeting the village green has had replacement posts erected to make the site secure from unwanted parking on the green.

Alfoxton Park – This property is back on the market. SW+T council enforcement officer is to visit the site on the 16th of this month with the current owner to see if the Grade II listed building is being properly maintained after reports from the public that it is falling into disrepair.

Mr Terry Ayres planning appeal for the site opposite the Plough has been successful. The appeals officer reports that any dispute over access is not within his remit.

The Play area on Portway is still locked as is the hard court. Only two comments were received from local people. The lack of interest in this suggests that the play area is not highly valued within the Parish. Please do submit your comments via the Clerk if you would like to make your views known. A suggestion regarding installing CCTV cameras has been found to be extremely expensive and is unlikely to be regarded as viable. Councillor Talling will be tasked with investigating whether the Housing Association is obliged to keep it open and in good repair.

The Parish Council is discussing introducing traffic speed calming measures with road signs warning of children and animals in the road. Councillor Young welcomes your comments. A Road Safety Committee has been set up to investigate the way forward.

The EDF Hinkley planning application to store nuclear waste from outside the area has been refused. The Parish Council sent in an objection to this proposal. This may go to appeal, however, the original planning conditions specifically excluded the storage of nuclear waste materials from other sites across the UK. The request to remove the environmental 'acoustic fish deterrent' has also been opposed by the Parish Council on the basis that if it was thought to be necessary in the original plan why should it now be considered superfluous? The Parish Council's submissions are available to view on the website.

Councillor Coplestone has made considerable progress in establishing the legal status of the dog pound. Documents will be submitted to the Land Registry in due course. Maintenance and improved access is on-going. The coat of arms is to be re-newed.

Contractors working installing ground source heat pumps at Combe Cottage requested signage to deter vehicles from turning on private land. As this access is privately owned the Parish Council decided that this is not within the PC's remit and is a matter for the land owners to address.

BT is **not** proposing to remove the phone box near the Plough. There is an opportunity to have an electric vehicle charging point in the village. At present the PC does not think it an option but may re-visit this in the future. Salt bags will shortly be stored outside the Village Hall. There are only 8 bags left.

Councillor Hugh Davies reported on County Council business. Of particular interest to parishioners is the possibility of borrowing an iPad from Minehead Library to aid with setting up a new business in the region.
